61/16 Report from the Clerk

The Clerk said he and the Chairman had met directors of Top Mops Ltd, at their request, and had used the opportunity to explain the planned tendering procedure. 62/16 IW Councillors reports

Cllr Bloomfield said IWC Members were to get a briefing on a medium term financial strategy. The Solent Deal had been backed by 71% of those who had responded, and 30% wanted a fixed link. Portsmouth City Council had agreed to go ahead. An independent noise assessment had been carried out at the former Lake Working Men's Club, where the restaurant had been converted to a gym. Cllr Hollands said he had received no reply from Bill Murphy regarding Cliff Rd. He suggested inviting Cllr Fuller to the public meeting, but Members agreed this would not be appropriate.

Cllr Theobald said there were loose paving stones at the War Memorial.

Cllr Horton said her IW Day tea had raised over £200 for the Hospice.

Cllr Anscomb queried the frequency of road sweeping, and lack of attention to back alleys.

Cllr White said Sandown Rotary would hold a Christmas Grotto event at their Lake Shop on 15 December.
